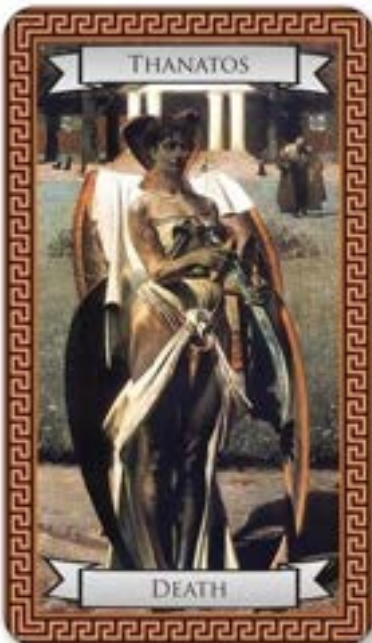
## Instructions

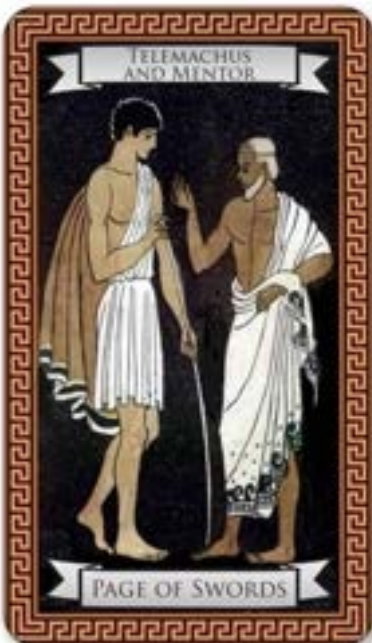












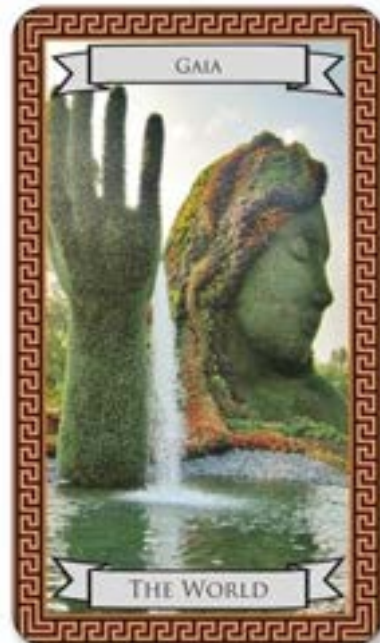
